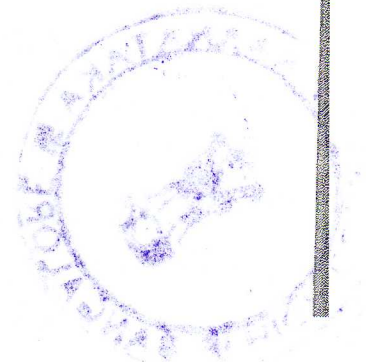

ORDER

This PIL petition is filed by the petitioner seeking several reliefs on the ground that respondents in utter violation of the Cigarettes and other Tobacco Products (Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of Trade & Commerce, Production, Supply & Distribution) Act, 2003, (the 'Act' for short), are sponsoring to the international tobacco promotion event called the Global Tobacco Networking Forum 2010 which was proposed to be held between 4th and 5th October 2010 at Bangalore. By virtue of the interim order, the petitioner was able to get all the reliefs except the prayers G to I. In the circumstances, by the order dated 7.1.2011, we had directed the Assistant Solicitor General of India to file the counter and to state as to whether prayers G to I can also be considered by the respondents. Today, a detailed counter is filed. In the counter, the Union of India has stated that they will follow and adhere to all the provisions of the aforesaid Act, and therefore, respondent No.3 submits that the petition has become infructuous.



2. We have perused the statement of objections filed by the Union of India. In view of the statement of objections filed, we are of the opinion that even prayers G to I have been complied with by the respondents since they have given an undertaking that they will not disobey any of the provisions of the aforesaid Act. In view of the same, we are of the opinion that the present petition has become infructuous due to subsequent development.

3. At this stage, the learned Counsel for the petitioner has filed an affidavit stating that the petitioner by way of affidavit would like to propose Code of Conduct for public officials to prevent Tobacco Industry's interference in developing and implementing public health policies and programs related to tobacco control. The learned Assistant Solicitor General submits that the proposal given by the petitioner would be considered properly by the Union of India while framing the Code of conduct for public officials to prevent Tobacco Industry's interference in developing and implementing public health policies and programs related to tobacco control.
